

HIGH PROFILE ADVISORY BOARD REINFORCE DTEX SYSTEMS LEADERSHIP IN USER MONITORING

Dtex Systems on target to support the new National Cyber Security Strategy.

Dtex Systems is launching its first UK Advisory Board with the appointment of four well-known figures from the UK's Information Security and Technology Sectors.

The announcement of the Advisory Board affirms the emergence of Dtex Systems as a recognised market leader in the 'User Intelligence' and 'Insider Threat' technology space. The protection of citizen data has now become front of mind for mobile operators, with both T-Mobile and Orange implementing the Dtex technology nation-wide.
